Network Updates

EARC

The long awaited upgrade proposal for EARC has been submitted for review by the building management and council. We are expecting to hear from them in the coming weeks with a response. Fingers crossed. Meanwhile enjoy this render from the CAD model of part of the proposal.



Cement Hill

After discovering issues with the installed PoE Injector, last Saturday Sam, James, Andrew and Shawn took a scheduled trip to change the PoE injectors over to 2x MikroTik RouterBoard 750UP's. While they were there they also tightened the guy wires as it has been one month since installation and the ancor locs had settled to their final resting place. So far the change in PoE injector has proven stable, but only time will tell for us to be certain.

Air-Stream

Suntrix-Hermitage

One of our members has been able to secure a Crane Truck for aiding the installation of a 900x900x900 Triangular mast. So the project has now moved into the planning stages for footings and digging.

Athelstone

After many years of operation Air-Stream Athelstone was finally upgraded, upgrading the power runs, Ethernet runs and radios. Once all is completed it will have moved from an 802.11a link to an 802.11n link which should yield 100mbit of throughput. It has also had a Dual Polarity 2.4ghz Omni installed, however it is currently disabled due to interference issues.

Upcoming Projects

Suntrix-Hermitage is a new build in Lower Hermitage, this will provide amazing connectivity between EARC and Modbury North.

EARC upgrade project proposal has been submitted and awaiting a response.

LHI-LCC-Glynde has passed the planning stage and is awaiting hardware to arrive for installation.

Lonsdale has been stumbled and hardware purchased now just awaiting a date for installation.

Air-Stream Wireless was established by a handful of dedicated wireless enthusiasts in 2001 and became an Incorporated Association in September 2002. It is the first and largest Community Wireless Network (CWN) in South Australia to successfully build a Wide Area Network (WAN) using wireless technologies.

With hundreds of active members the network now forms part of the largest community wireless network in Australia and is continuing to grow with the help of wireless enthusiasts and radio amateurs across Adelaide and Australia.
